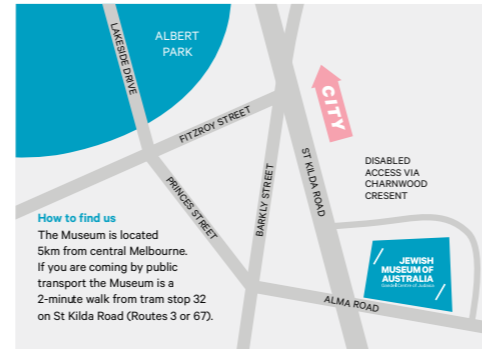


# AMY WINEHOUSE: A Family Portrait

Amy Winehouse (1983–2011) was a lauded singer, songwriter and fashion icon named “the pre-eminent vocal talent of her generation” by the BBC. Beyond that, she was a much-loved sister, deeply close with her family, and immensely proud of her Jewish-London roots. *Amy Winehouse: A Family Portrait* is a personal and intimate exhibition which explores Amy Winehouse’s inner world, and the influences that shaped her career and personal life. Curated by the Jewish Museum London with Amy’s brother, Alex and her sister-in-law, Riva, the Winehouse family gave unprecedented access to Amy’s belongings, which focuses on Amy’s Jewish roots, family life, adolescence and her early career.

Don’t miss your chance to visit the only place in Australia to host the Amy Winehouse exhibition, featuring an events program as eclectic as the pop diva herself.
